Data was collected by visiting each 15 blogs and related information collected from the respective blog website. This study shows that 12 blogs have more than 10 years of longevity, and they are in the most popular blog list. It is also found that all blogs since their origin till the year 2019 are active. It reflects their credibility. Author finds out that 73.33% of blogs maintaining the most prominent feature of blog 'About Blog' and 53.33% blogs having the at a glance ides of their purpose with the 'Subtitle' given t the library blog.


through links to their publications, which helps validate the blog content found on the blog. The blog contents never go through the peer review process, so they have their authority.
